Institutional Scholarship and Financial Assistance Program for Undergraduate Students (ISFAPUS)

#### L Rationale

The Philippine Constitution, Article XIV, Section I stipulates that the State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all and shall establish and maintain a system of scholarship, grants, student loan programs, subsidies, and other incentives which shall be available to deserving students in both public and private schools, especially to the underprivileged (Article XIV, Section 2). The Surigao State College of Technology continually provides Institutional programs to ensure that the highlighted provisions are met, hence, the creation of Institutional Scholarship and Financial Assistance Program for Undergraduate Students (ISFAPUS).

#### II. Program Title and Coverage

The program shall be known as the Institutional Scholarship and Financial Assistance Program for Undergraduate Students (ISFAPUS). The beneficiaries of this program are the academically deserving, talented, and underprivileged students in all campuses of Surigao State College of Technology.

The following are the specific program components and sub-components:

# A. SSCT Academic Scholarship Program (ASP)

- President's List. This scholarship is open to students who excel academically and duly recognized by the Registrar.
- Dean's List. This scholarship is open to students who excel academically and duly recognized by the Registrar.

# B. Culture, Arts, and Sport Scholarship (CAS)

- Chorale Scholarship. This scholarship is open to all members of SSCT Choral duly recognized and recommended by the Chorale Director and Director of Wellness, Sports, Culture; the Arts on a yearly basis.
- ii. Dance Troupe Scholarship. This scholarship is open to all members of SSCT Dance Troupe duly recognized and recommended by the Dance Troupe Coordinator and Director, for Sports and Wellness and Director of Student Affairs on a yearly basis.
- iii. Athletic Scholarship. This program is open to students who are members of SSCT-Athletic Team duly recognized and recommended by the Sports Director/Coordinator and Director of Student Affairs on a yearly basis.

# C. PWD/LSENs and IP's Financial Assistance

- i. Person with Disability/ Learners with Special Educational Needs Scholarship
- ii. Indigenous People Scholarship

# D. Drum and Bugle Financial Assistance

 Drum and Bugle Corps. This scholarship is open to all members of SSCT Marching Band.

#### III. Purpose

ISFAPUS aims to provide financial aid to financially underprivileged but academically deserving and talented students. In this way, there will be increased student diversity necessary to build a community of learners in a culture of mutual understanding and sensitivity to others.

#### IV. Funding

All funding requirements of the ISFAPUS shall be charged against the school funds.

#### V. General Qualification Requirements

The following are the guidelines for the applicants to be qualified for the scholarship:

- 1. Must be a Filipino.
- 2. Must be officially enrolled in any program catered by the school.

- 3. Must possess good moral standing.
- 4. Have not availed of any scholarship or financial assistance program, except for Special Population beneficiaries.

# VI. Application Procedures and Documentary Requirements

Applicants are advised to follow the stipulated process.

- 1. Pass the admission test.
- 2. Pass the interview.
- 3. Submit a Certificate of Good Moral Character from the last school attended.
- 4. Secure an endorsement from SFAU Office and Registrar.
- 5. Submit the accomplished ISFAPUS Application Form directly to the SFAU Office within one month after the first day of classes.
- 6. Approval from the Scholarship Committee.
- 7. Carry a regular load of the semester enrolled.
- 8. Maintain good moral character.

#### Vili. Renewal of Scholarship

A scholarship may be renewed upon evaluation of the student's academic performance and fulfillment of responsibilities as a scholar per school year. It may include summer and introductory courses or remedial subjects if there are, as required in the curriculum.

# IX. Availment of Institutional Scholarship/Grant

- The SSCT Institutional Scholarship and Financial Assistance Program for Undergraduate (ISFAPUS) is over and above the financial grants provided from other government scholarship and financial grant providers.
- The scholar/grantee can choose the scholarship/grant which is higher in terms of financial benefits provided that the student is qualified to the said scholarship/grant.

#### X. Leave of Absence

A student must file a leave of absence in case he/she stops attending school within the current and next semester. Leave of Absence is allowed for 1 (one) school year only provided that it is still covered in the specified year of agreement.

# XI. Grounds for Cancellation of Scholarship

Scholars must strictly observe the rules and regulations of the institution and of the beneficiary's agency. The following are grounds for the cancellation of scholarship:

- 1. Any act of immorality like drunkenness, dishonesty, forgery, discourtesy, and insulting person in authority;
- 2. Any act that is considered immoral in Philippine social norms; and
- 3. Membership/participation in any subversive organizations.

#### XII. Incentives/Awards

Aside from the financial assistance of the institution, scholars will also receive rewards in representing the college during national and international competitions.

#### b. Means of Verification

The student must present the following:

- 1. Official invitation to the competition
- 2. Memorandum to participate from the college
- 3. Official program
- 4. Narrative report with pictures
- 5. Certificate of Award

#### XIII. Responsibilities of implementers:

- a. Scholarship and Financial Assistance Unit (SFAU)
  - i. Accepts and screens applicants for ISFAPUS;
  - ii. Monitors and evaluates the academic performance of all ISFAPUS Scholars;
  - iii. Submits reports to the Student Affairs Office after the end of the semester for the terminated and continuing ISFAPUS beneficiaries;
  - iv. Releases Notice of New ISFAPUS Grantees or Notice of Continuing ISFAPUS Grant to ISFAPUS beneficiaries;
  - v. Orients the ISFAPUS Scholars on their obligations, and of the rules and regulations of the program:
  - vi. Conducts meetings of the College ISFAPUS Committee; and
  - vii. Maintains a database of the ISFAPUS beneficiaries.

#### b. Guidance Office

- i. Designs, selects, and administers the ISFAPUS Qualifying Examination to applicants;
- ii. Provides guidance and counseling services to the beneficiaries; and
- iii. Designs guidance program for the ISFAPUS beneficiaries to remediate academic, persona-social, and career needs and concerns.

#### c. Student Affairs Office (SAO)

- i. Issues certification to students who are PWDs/LSENs;
- ii. Coordinates with the Sports Director, Choir Director, and Dance Troupe Director for the list of recommended students:
- iii. Helps in identifying potential students qualified for ISFAPUS:
- iv. Monitors the SFAU Office, Guidance Office, and other related offices in the implementation of their functions; and
- v. Administers tracer and evaluation studies of the program.

#### d. Registrar's Office

- i. Releases grades of the ISFAPUS beneficiaries every after end of the semester;
- ii. Issues certification to students who received academic awards (PL and DL) for two consecutive semesters; and
- iii. Prints Certificate of Registration (COR) to ISFAPUS beneficiaries without initial payment but only a copy of the Notice of New ISFAPUS Grant or Notice of Continuing ISFAPUS Grant.
- e. Accounting Office, Cashier's Office, and Budget Office
  - i. Processes the release of monthly stipend of ISFAPUS beneficiaries; and
  - ii. Accommodates queries of beneficiaries regarding their financial accountabilities.

# XIV. Implementing Committees

a. The ISFAPUS Committee is composed of the following:

- b. Functions of the ISFAPUS Committee are as follows:
  - i. Oversees the operation and implementation of the program;
  - ii. Enhances policies that will ensure that the services provided for by the program shall serve the target students;
  - iii. Decides on appeals, grievances, complaints, request for additional slots; and
  - iv. Monitors and evaluates the administration and implementation of the program.
